I. Obeying the First Commandment – Multiply!

- A. The first command in the Bible is to "Be fruitful and multiply." (Genesis 1:28, NLT)
- B. What is the kingdom like? It starts small but multiplies to enormous size.
 - 1. Mustard Seed (Matthew 13:31-32)
 - 2. Yeast (Matthew 13:33) It has amazing growing power!
- C. There are two paradigm shifts and two levels of multiplication.
 - 1. The 2 Paradigm Shifts
 - a) Paradigm Shift 1: Moving from doing ministry to giving ministry away
 - (1) IRTDMN (Identify, Recruit, Train, Deploy, Monitor, Nurture)
 - b) Paradigm Shift 2: Moving from giving ministry away to creating systems that fuel growth
 - (1) Organic is complicated. Living organisms are not simple at all!
 - (2) Love people enough to do the hard work of putting effective, vibrant systems in place!
 - c) Wimber understood both as captured in IRTDMN and Doing Church.
 - d) Systems look simple to the end user, but they are usually fairly complex in terms of backend design and implementation. (Think of your own body systems or an iPhone.)
 - 2. Two dimensions to multiplication
 - a) Mindset
 - b) Methods
- D. Embrace a multiplication mindset:

The Leader Thinks	Addition	Multiplication
Growth Is Fueled by	Working Harder	Working Smarter
They Need to Fix	People	System
Organic Means	Simple	Complex
As Ministry Grows	Workload Grows	Span of Care Remains the Same

- E. To move from Addition to Multiplication:
 - 1. Be Persistent (time and determination).
 - 2. Be Eager (to learn from whomever).
 - 3. Keep Experimenting.

II. Understanding Disciple Making Movements

- A. The Disciple Making Movement (DMM) is something that God is doing around the world.
- B. There are different expressions—one of these that began in India and has spread to Africa, and North and South America—includes at the heart of its system the Discovery Group format.
- C. Key DMM Principles:
 - 1. Prayer is foundational.
 - 2. Discipleship begins before conversion.
 - 3. God is already drawing people, and we just need to partner with him. (John 5:19) "Do what the Father is doing!"
 - 4. Simple and immediate obedience to the Bible is central.
 - 5. The thrust of the groups is outward into more relational networks.
